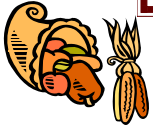

It's that time of year when people start reflecting on the year that has passed and realizing all that we have to be thankful for, too. Our patrons have LOTS to be thankful for in terms of recent developments at the Basler Library! Here's an update on what has been going on in the past few weeks!

In case you have not been in the Library recently, the great news is that **all** of the computers on the second and third floor of the Library have been upgraded! The new computers have the Windows 2007 package, which means that the Word, Excel, and PowerPoint programs are all up-to-date. These computers are much faster and have a bigger monitor with a clearer image. Also, there are two flash drive ports on the left side of the monitor — so no more acrobatics needed to plug in your thumb drive! The "My Math Lab" program is also available on all of the computers.

Additionally, all students, faculty, and staff can now access the wireless network on their personal computers from all over campus, including the entire Library. You must register for the access by going to Northeast State's web page at www.northeaststate.edu and choosing "Students" under **Northeast State Links** on the left side of the page. Then choose "Wireless Access Request" from the bottom of the list on the left side of the screen. Fill in the required information and submit the request. You will receive an e-mail to your campus webmail account when wireless access is granted.

Of course, the Library does have a limited number of laptops that you can check out from the Circulation Desk to use on the second and third floors of the Library. These laptops have Internet access and copies of some of the programs that are used in the classrooms.

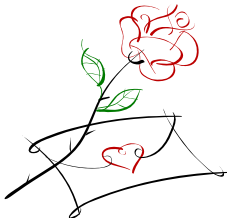

Exactly 100 days after marrying Andy Graham, Ellen's path crosses with that of Leo – her ex-boyfriend. The ex with whom she never had closure, the ex with whom she never understood why things ended the way that they had or when they had. And what she thinks is just a chance sighting extends into a brief chat in a New York City diner, then edges into the photographic work assignment of a lifetime – with the accompanying article written by none other than Leo. It eventually spirals into something that Ellen not only cannot understand, but also cannot control. Old feelings and longings, unrequited romance, and a severe lack of closure result when Ellen and Andy leave New York to settle in Atlanta. Atlanta, which is Andy's hometown; where Andy's family lives; where Southern genteel society does not necessarily appeal to or welcome Ellen, a proud native of Pittsburgh, PA.
