Sometimes when students are given a research assignment, the most frustrating part is knowing where to start. Of course, the Library Staff is here to help, but we also offer numerous help aids designed with students in mind.

One such aid is our Research Guides. The Basler Library's Research Guides offer a sort of "jumping-off" place for students to begin with various research topics. We have created 26 Research Guides that cover broad topics such as Art & Art History, Women's History, Chemistry, Censorship, Mathematics, Computer Sciences, Astronomy, Tennessee History, Mechanical Technology, Literary Criticism, Drafting Design Technology, and more! Each Research Guide offers the same basic type of information and is tailored to different ways that different students may undertake the research process.

The first "section" of each Research Guide offers **subject headings**, especially helpful for students who want to begin their research by identifying different subject headings in the Online Catalog. For example, the Education Research Guide suggests subject headings such as "Adult Education," "Distance Education," "Early Childhood Education," and "Vocational Education," among others. Students can enter these subject headings into a "subject search" in the Online Catalog to retrieve a list of materials that will assist them in the research process.

The second "section" gives **call numbers for browsing**. Some students prefer going directly to the bookshelves to look around for what is available. The Research Topics Research Guide, for example, gives a call number range (HN 1-981) for the topic "Social History, Social Problems, Social Reform," and a call number range (HV1-9960) for "Social Pathology, Social and Public Welfare, Criminology." With this information, students can search more efficiently, without wasting valuable time.

The third section lists **databases** containing information geared to the general topic covered in each Research Guide. Additionally, there is a brief description given of the database so that students can know a little more about what to expect (full-text, dates, etc.).

In the fourth section, students will find the names of some of the Library's "physical" **Journals** — journals that we receive in hard-copy or paper format — that pertain to each broad topic. Some topics lend themselves to more narrowly-defined areas than others. For example, any of the "science-related" or "technical-related" Research Guides will have more rigidly "science" or "technical" journals than will "Speech Topics," "Research Topics," or "Public Speaking."

Most Research Guides move next into the various books that might be useful for the various topics covered. Sometimes these lists of **Books** will include materials from the Reference Collection; others may include only books from the Circulating Collection. All, however, include basic bibliographic information such as author, title, city of publication, publisher, copyright date, and call number. Most also include a special section that includes titles found in our electronic book (e-book) collections such as netLibrary and Safari. Once book titles have been suggested, students will find a similar section that deals with audio-visual suggestions, complete with titles and call numbers.

The final section of each Research Guide features **Internet Sites** that the Reference Department has identified as pertinent, helpful, or otherwise useful to the topic covered in each Research Guide. Note that links are checked periodically, but that broken/dead links may result at any time. If you notice broken/dead links or incorrect information on any of the Research Guides, please contact Chrissie Anderson Peters at capeters@NortheastState.edu.

The Research Guides may be accessed from our Library website (www.NortheastState.edu/Library — under "Library Resources"), or may be picked up in paper format in the Reference Room on the third floor of the Library.

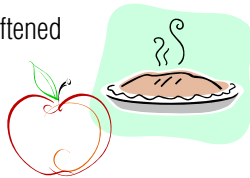

American As Apple Pie

Caramel Apple Pie

(Virginia Salmon, Librarian,
recipe from *Southern Living*)

- 8 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1 egg
- 1 ½ teaspoon vanilla
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 1 tablespoon flour
- 1 (8 ounce) graham cracker crust
- 12 ounces frozen scalloped apples (Stouffer's)
- 1/3 cup caramel topping
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon



Preheat oven to 350°. In mixing bowl, combine cream cheese, egg, vanilla, sugar, and flour. Beat until smooth. Spread mixture over pie crust.

Combine apples, cinnamon and topping. Gently spoon mixture over cream cheese. Place pie pan on a cookie sheet and bake for 40 to 50 minutes.

Serve at room temperature with whipped topping or ice cream, if desired. Refrigerate any leftover pie.
