

**Transfer Agreement (Aviation Technology) Between
NORTHEAST STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE (NeSCC)
AND
TENNESSEE COLLEGE OF APPLIED TECHNOLOGY (TCAT), MORRISTOWN, TN**

This transfer agreement between Northeast State Community College and Tennessee College of Applied Technology, Morristown, TN will provide TCAT students the opportunity to earn an Associate of Applied Science degree in Aviation Technology through NeSCC.

This agreement consists of two parts: Terms of Agreement and Implementation Procedures.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

Tennessee Center of Applied Technology-Morristown, TN students who have successfully completed the Aviation Maintenance Technology program and have earned a Federal Aviation Administration Airframe and Powerplant license are eligible to apply for the NeSCC Associate of Applied Science degree in Aviation Technology.

Tennessee Center of Applied Technology-Morristown, TN students will receive full credit for Northeast State Community College courses listed in the table below.

TCAT students who currently possess an Associate’s Degree from NeSCC may meet all or some of the general education requirements for the Aviation Technology Associate of Applied Science degree. In addition, credits from other accredited institutions may be applied. The student’s transcripts will be reviewed prior to awarding credit. A student must take, as a minimum, 25% of the degree total credit hours at Northeast State Community College.

IMPLEMENTATION PROCEDURES

1. Each party to this agreement shall be responsible for providing its students the appropriate printed materials that describe this document and the requirements of the articulated degree program.

2. Northeast State Community College shall provide the necessary courses and properly advise and register students into these courses.

3. It shall be the joint responsibility of the Vice President for Academic Affairs of Northeast Community College, or his/her designees, and the TCAT President or his/her designees, to meet periodically to discuss the program listed in this agreement and to make additions, deletions, and/or revisions necessary to maintain the integrity and accuracy of the documents. To ensure the proper maintenance of accurate and responsible advising for both new and returning students, additions, deletions, and/or revisions, and any changes to the programs and this agreement, shall be implemented no later than 120 days prior to the beginning of the fall term of the Northeast State Community College academic year.

4. Either institution may terminate this agreement during its term by giving written notice to the other party subject to the following provisions:

- Should either or both institutions decide to withdraw from this agreement, it is agreed that any and all students enrolled in this program will be given the opportunity to complete the program of study described in this articulation agreement.


- Written notice shall be given no later than December 1 of that current academic year.
