



Steps for Enrollment

Step 1: Apply for Admission*

Apply online at www.NortheastState.edu/Apply or print the application from our website and mail/fax to us.

Step 2: Complete Your Admission File*

The following items must be submitted before the first day of classes:

1. Completed application for admission.
2. Official high school transcript with graduation date OR high school equivalency (GED®/HiSET®) scores.
3. Official college transcripts, if applicable, from each college attended.
4. Proof of immunization with two doses of Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccine if born after January 1, 1957.
5. Proof of immunization with two doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox) vaccine if born after January 1, 1980 and enrolling as a full-time student (at least 12 credit hours per semester).
6. Completed Northeast State Hepatitis B Immunization Health History Form.
7. ACT or SAT scores if test was taken in the past five years.
8. Proof of citizenship or lawful presence in the United States (Driver's License).

Step 3: Apply for Financial Aid*

To be considered for financial assistance from the federal government and/or the State of Tennessee, you must complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.gov. To get assistance with completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), contact our Financial Aid Help Center at fahelpcenter@NortheastState.edu. Step 4: Apply for Financial Assistance Through Northeast State*

Step 5: Placement Testing

You may be required to take a computerized placement test designed to assist the College in placing you into the most appropriate courses. The test covers basic skill areas in writing, reading, and mathematics. Test time is individualized. For more information, check out www.NortheastState.edu/Assessment.

Step 6: Participate in Orientation

Once your admission file and any placement testing have been completed, first-time college students will be required to participate in New Student Orientation. During New Student Orientation you will meet with an academic advisor and register for classes. Contact the Office of Enrollment Services at 423.323.0229 to register for a New Student Orientation session.

Step 7: Pay Your Fees

All fees are payable by the payment due date listed in our Registration Guide which can be accessed via our website. If you register for classes after the due date, fees are due the day you register. Registration is incomplete until all tuition and fees are paid. To pay your bill, go to www.NortheastState.edu/AccountSuite.

Step 8: Prepare for Classes

iPad Requirement

Students enrolling in credit courses at Northeast State are required to lease or purchase an iPad® that meets minimum operating system requirements (Apple iOS 9 or greater with 32 GB). iOPTiN & eTextbooks

Much of your required course materials may be delivered digitally through the iOPTiN program. You will see an "eTextbook Cost" associated with each applicable course as you register for the class. You are automatically "opted in" to the program, but you are also provided with a window of opportunity to "opt out" of the program.
