

child care access means parents in school

CCAMPIS is a federally funded program that provides eligible Northeast State students with childcare subsidies to 3-Star Quality licensed providers. Focus is on full-day care for infants through pre-school ages. A sliding fee scale will be used to determine parent cost to the provider.



Student Eligibility Requirements:

- Infant through preschool dependent child(ren)
- Completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) with EFC below \$10,000
- · Enrolled in degree or certificate program
- Attend CCAMPIS Orientation
- Enrolled in at least 6 credit hours per semester

Preference given to students:

- Date of completed application packet
- With an unmet need for full-time childcare assistance
- Enrolled full-time
- Pell Grant eligible
- Minimum GPA of 2.5 for previously enrolled students

Provider Requirements:

- Meet the Tennessee Department of Human Services definition of "daycare center", which offers care to thirteen or more children
- Licensed childcare center by TN DHS with a 3-Star Quality rating

Childcare center information, 3-Star Quality rating, and compliance history report can be found through the *Tennessee Department of Human Services* website at https://www.tn.gov/accweb/.

CCAMPIS funds will be provided for the fall and spring semesters and during official college breaks. (Summer subsidies may be available.) All subsidies are provided directly to the childcare center. Student fees are paid by the student directly to the childcare center. Students are responsible for all other center fees.



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
